CAMP DIRECTIONS

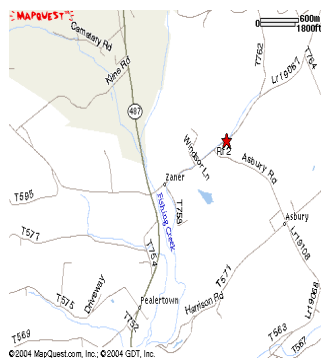

FAMILY CAMP RULES

Everyone is under the regulations of the Camp as soon as they arrive on the grounds and until they leave to go home. This applies to all visitors, campers and staff. The staff is in charge of all programming and activities under the direction of the Dean.

Christian conduct is expected at all times. This automatically excludes all profanity, vulgarity, name calling, and teasing. All visitors, campers, and staff are expected to treat each other as Christ would treat them.

Any form of tobacco, illegal drugs, or alcoholic beverages may NOT be used in any form. This applies to all persons on the grounds.

No food of any kind is allowed in the dorms! This is necessary for the health and safety of the campers. Food attracts animals, insects, and may promote bacteria and disease. Please do not hide or store any food, candy, or other edible items in your luggage.

Radios, televisions, games, video games, tape players, pocketknives, guns, fishing gear, archery equipment, non-biblical books, matches, lighters, or pets are not permitted. Please put them in your cars and leave them there.

Males are not permitted to enter female side of the dorm. Females are not permitted to enter male side of the dorm. Those in the Family Dorm are expected to respect the privacy and modesty of others. ALL CAMPERS ARE EXPECTED TO REMAIN IN THE MAIN AREA OF ACTIVITY. Do not wander off. The woods, stream, road and parking areas are off limits. Anyone (staff or camper) must sign out before leaving camp.

The watchword for family camp dress is modesty. No short shorts, bare midriffs, bare feet, or half t-shirts for men or women will be permitted. Bike curfew is 8:00 PM. Camp curfew is at Midnight. The bike curfew is for the safety of the rider and pedestrians. The camp curfew is for everyone. Automobiles, trucks, vans and other forms of transportation are to be parked and not moved unless you are leaving camp. There are too many people at camp to have people driving around. See the dean if you have a special need. Camp speed limit is 10 m.p.h. Watch for children, pedestrians, and bikes.

Please report any medical problems to the camp nurse immediately. There is a hospital 15 minutes away, and we do have camp insurance.

MEALS

Your meals are included in your registration cost. You and your family will enjoy the delicious, Camp Epachiseca meals. The camp store is open for you to purchase drinks and snacks at certain times throughout the weekend.

HOUSING

At Family Camp, you can sleep in the dorms or bring a tent, RV, or camper. There are separate male and female dorms and a family dorm with separate bathrooms. Children must be accompanied by an adult if sleeping in the dorms. There are a limited number of RV sites with water and electricity. Please indicate your desired sleeping accommodations on your registration form. All spaces are allotted on a first register & reserved (deposit included) basis.

REGISTRATION

The fees for Family Camp are per family:

Early Registration is \$99 for 3 days, \$66 for 2 days, \$33 for 1 day.

Late registration is \$120 for 3 days, \$80 for 2 days, \$40 for 1 day.

A \$25.00 registration deposit must accompany your registration form to reserve your housing. The remaining balance is due upon check in at camp. Please make checks out to "E.
